Research and Professional Development Scholarship

In light of COVID-19, SJC's annual travel and finishing scholarships have been adapted this year into one scholarship awarded to qualified residents in support of research and professional development. This year's scholarship will particularly recognize residents who have demonstrated outstanding citizenship as members of the SJC community during what has been a challenging year for everyone. ***While all residents are encouraged to apply, the key criteria that the adjudication committee will be looking for in the applications this year will be contributions to college life through stepping up to participate in community engagement and volunteer work in service of the SJC community.***

SJC residents are encouraged to apply for this scholarship to help fund activities and expenses such as (but are not limited to):

- Registration fees for virtual workshops, conferences, courses, and other training or professional development opportunities
- Equipment for academic research or professional use
- Membership and/or access to archival material, databases
- Hiring a research assistant to assist in research activities, data collection, etc. in another country that you cannot travel to due to COVID-19
- Hiring professional to provide expert support for academic projects

Please note that this list is non-exhaustive.

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- Be enrolled in a graduate degree program, regretfully Juris Doctorates are not eligible.
- Display a high level of academic achievement and/or demonstrable contributions made to the community life at the College.
- Application can be made during the first year of membership; however, priority will be given to residents who have completed one year of residency.
- Maintain residence in the College during the term for which the award is made.
- Only one Research and Professional Development Scholarship will be granted to a student during a course of study at UBC [one per degree].
- Present their research or work if awarded the scholarship. The Academic Committee will organize the presentations and advise who will be presenting. Presentations should be 3-5 minutes long with 2 minutes of additional time for questions, OR, as directed by the St. John's College Academic Committee.
- Commit to providing a statement (between 200 to 300 words) indicating how the awarded fellowship assisted you in your graduate studies. Please use specific examples of how it supported your graduate research. This statement should be provided by August 1, 2021.

Application Instructions:

All documents, including the letter of support from a supervisor, are due by **Thursday, April 15, 2021**; incomplete applications will not be considered.

Applicants must submit:

1. A letter of application (maximum 750 words) detailing:
 - what living at the College has meant to the applicant
 - the contributions they have made to the College that include specific examples
 - how the award will assist them during and/or in the completion of their course of study
2. A budget, amount applying for and how it will be used
3. A letter of support from their supervisor, speaking to how the scholarship would benefit the applicant's research or studies, and may include what makes the applicant an outstanding citizen at UBC. Please refer to Instructions for Referees available on our website.

All documentation should be forwarded to the SJC Membership Coordinator, at sjc.membership@ubc.ca, by the deadline date of Thursday, April 15, 12:00 pm.
